BLUE-STEMMED GOLDENROD

Solidago caesia

Clump-forming, non-aggressive growing Goldenrod with arching, purple stems, and small clusters of daisy-like yellow flowers.
Very attractive to pollinators and deer tolerant!

Growing Information

Sunlight Full sun to part shade
Soil Type Dry to medium, well-drained
Height 1.5–3'
Flowering calendar August to September

Benefits for Wildlife

Leaves Yes
Flowers Yes
Fruit
Seeds

Host to 124 caterpillar species, including:
(common names) The Asteroid; Brown-hooded Owlet; Green Leuconycta; Wavy-lined Emerald

Benefits for People

- Smaller and less aggressive than other goldenrods
