BUNCHBERRY

Chamaepericlymenum canadense

Small, hardy accent or groundcover with beautiful foliage, flowers, and fruit. The fruit is edible and makes a delicious jam!

Benefits for Wildlife

- Fruit eaten by songbirds, game birds, chipmunks, martens, rabbits, and bears
- Provides nesting sites for ground-nesting birds
- Foliage browsed by deer and moose

Benefits for People

- Attractive, durable groundcover and accent plant
- Beautiful white flowers give way to red edible berries in late summer
- Native Americans cooked berries into puddings and sauces
