COASTAL SWEET PEPPERBUSH

Clethra alnifolia

Also known as Summersweet. Medium to large shrub with interesting leaves and showy, fragrant, long-lasting white flowers in midsummer. Well adapted to varied growing conditions, very hardy.

Species is listed as Species of Concern in Maine.

Benefits for Wildlife

- Flowers attract butterflies and hummingbirds
- Songbirds and mammals feed on the fruit

• Host for the Sweet Pepperbush Nola Moth, *Nola clethrae*

Benefits for People

• Beautiful, fragrant flowers that last up to six weeks

· Leaves turn golden yellow in fall

• Forms broad, dense thicket ideal for hedge row or screen
