

WHITE TURTLEHEAD

Chelone glabra

This striking perennial has lance-shaped, dark green leaves and white snapdragon-like flowers that resemble turtle heads. The name is derived from Greek mythology: the nymph Chelone was turned into a turtle for insulting the Gods.

Benefits for Wildlife

- Attracts a wide variety of pollinators, including butterflies and hummingbirds
- Bumblebees are the only bees strong enough to pry open the flower
- Primary host of Baltimore Checkerspot butterfly, Euphydryas phaeton

Host to 4 caterpillar species: (common names) Turtlehead Borer; Satyr Pug; Verbena Bud Moth; Baltimore Checkerspot

Benefits for People

- Adds late summer charm to shade gardens and is a great accent plant.
- Native Americans had many medicinal uses for this plant
