WILD STRAWBERRY

Fragaria virginiana

A beautiful and edible cool-season perennial ground cover, with white flowers and red fruit. Attractive to native pollinators and useful for erosion control.

Deer and drought tolerant.

Benefits for Wildlife

- Excellent for pollinators, especially the Rose Miner Bee, *Andrena melanochroa*
- Sole plant host of the Strawberry Cutworm, Strawberry Tortrix, and Miranda moths
- Many mammals feast on small berries

Host to 81 caterpillar species, including: (common names) Isabella Tiger Moth; Crocus Geometer; Gray Hairstreak; Bronzed Cutworm; Himmelman's Plume Moth

Benefits for People

- Delicious edible fruit when ripe, sweeter than our grocery store varieties!
- · Deep red foliage in the fall
- Hardy native groundcover
