

BLACK WILLOW

Salix nigra

Fast-growing, medium to large sized water-loving tree, great for erosion control and flood prevention. Bark and twigs are commonly browsed by wildlife.

Benefits for Wildlife

- Early spring pollen and nectar for native bees
- Beavers browse foliage in the summer and bark in the winter
- Roots prevent soil erosion along stream banks

Host to 434 caterpillar species, including: (common names) Mourning Cloak; Locust Underwing; Hourglass Furcula; White Furcula; Green Comma; Clymene Moth; Viceroy; Definite Tussock Moth; Small-eyed Sphinx Interrupted Dagger Moth

Benefits for People

- Wood and twigs can be used for furniture, construction materials, and basket weaving
- Lightweight and durable wood was once used for prosthetics
