

BLUE-STEMMED GOLDENROD

Solidago caesia

Clump-forming, non-aggressive goldenrod with arching, purple stems, and small clusters of daisy-like yellow flowers. Very attractive to pollinators and deer tolerant!

Benefits for Wildlife

- Flowers attract pollinating bees, butterflies, wasps, and flies
- Supports multiple species of specialized bees
- Seeds are a food source for migrating birds in fall and resident birds in winter

Host to 124 caterpillar species, including: (common names) The Asteroid; Brownhooded Owlet; Green Leuconycta; Wavylined Emerald

Benefits for People

- Smaller and less aggressive than other goldenrods
- Drought and shade tolerant
