

# **COMMON ELDERBERRY**

Sambucus canadensis

Large, full shrub produces showy white flowers and edible fruit. Food source for countless insects, pollinators, songbirds, and mammals.

### **Benefits for Wildlife**

- Roots and foliage create overhanging banks on streams, creating cover for aquatic life
- Song birds, game birds, rodents, and bears devour the berries

Host to 37 caterpillar species, including: (common names) White-lined sphinx; Imperial moth; Cecropia silkmoth; Polyphemus moth; White-marked tussock moth; American vine moth; Elder shoot border moth; Maple bud borer

## **Benefits for People**

- Very easy to grow and adaptable
- Large, showy shrub with beautiful blooms and fruit clusters
- Edible fruit and flowers were historically used for wine, tea, jam, medicine and dyes
- Wood can be used for arrows, flutes, toys, etc.
