

LITTLE BLUESTEM

Schizachyrium scoparium

Heat and drought tolerant, this wonderful native provides year-round interest with blue-green foliage in the summer, followed by orangish-burgundy fall color. The silvery-white seed tufts persist into winter.

Benefits for Wildlife

- Food plant for grasshoppers, leaf-mining beetles, and leafhoppers
- Seeds are eaten by songbirds
- Clumping habit makes for great nesting and roosting sites

Host to 4 caterpillar species: Crossline Skipper; Leonard's Skipper; Indian Skipper; Stereomita andropogonis

Benefits for People

- Excellent for erosion control
- Year-round color interest
- Deer resistant
