

# THIN-LEAVED SUNFLOWER

Helianthus decapetalus

Elegant perennial native sunflower that can tolerate varied tough spots and shade. Helianthus is a major caterpillar host throughout most of Maine, and several species of bees specialize on its flowers.

### **Benefits for Wildlife**

- There are at least six species of bees and ten species of Lepidoptera that specialize on Helianthus
- Seeds eaten by songbirds, game birds, and small mammals
- Muskrats eat foliage and use stems for lodge building materials

Host to 60 caterpillar species, including (common names): Isabella Tiger Moth (Wooly Bear caterpillars); Painted Lady; Whitemarked Tussock; Eight-spot moth; Authographa flagellum

# **Benefits for People**

- Deer resistant
- Responds well to pruning (to encourage spreading and blooms) and dividing
