

# **CANADA WILD GINGER**

Asarum canadense

Fantastic groundcover for shade and woodland gardens! A slow spreader, via rhizomes, each plant consists of two heart-shaped velvety leaves. A great alternative to its non-native counterpart, European Ginger.

#### **Benefits for Wildlife**

- Great food source for early pollinators
- Seeds are dispersed by Aphaenogaster rudis ants in return for the lipid-rich coating

Host to 2 caterpillar species: (common names) Pipevine Swallowtail; Boldfeathered Grass Moth

## **Benefits for People**

- Root used as a ginger substitute
- Unique sweet-smelling flowers
- Tolerant to deer browsing and erosion
