

# FLOWERING RASPBERRY

Rubus odoratus

A beautiful shrub with fragrant long lasting blossoms and large vibrant green foliage. Unlike others in the rubus genus, *Rubus odoratus* is thornless making it a much friendlier garden addition!

Soil Type High organic material, sand/

loam, dry, moist, well-drained,

acidic-neutral

Height 3-6'

Flowering calendar June - September
