PLANTAIN-LEAVED PUSSYTOES

Antennaria plantaginifolia

Named for its cat-paw-like flower heads, this low-growing perennial makes an excellent ground cover. Leaves are wooly and silvery-green, and the flowers range from white (male) to light pink (female).

Benefits for Wildlife

- Great flowers for spring pollinators
- While the American Lady is best known for its host plant interaction, the four other butterflies listed below rely solely on this plant.

Host to 5 caterpillar species:
(common names) American Lady;
Oval Telethusia; Pussy's Toes Pyrausta;
White-spotted Midget; Agonopterix
Nebulosa

Benefits for People

- Deer resistant
- Interesting foliage
- Can form a groundcover and makes a great lawn replacement
