FLOWERING RASPBERRY

Rubus odoratus

A beautiful shrub with fragrant long lasting blossoms and large vibrant green foliage. Unlike others in the rubus genus, this plant is thornless, making it a much friendlier garden addition!

Benefits for Wildlife

- Pollinators enjoy nectar from the flowers
- Some bees use pieces of leaves as nesting materials
- Large leaves make this plant a favorite hiding spot for birds

Host to 161 caterpillar species, including: (common names) Scribe Moth; Io Moth; Hoary Pinion Moth; Isabella Tiger Moth; Wavy-lined Moth; White-line Sphinx; Blinded Sphinx; Hickory Tussock Moth

Benefits for People

- Adaptable plant that thrives in varied landscapes
- Beautiful, long-lasting flowers
