

# NARROW-LEAVED BLUE-EYED-GRASS

Sisyrinchium angustifolium

When in bloom, this is a plant that is certain to stop garden visitors in their tracks. The grass-like foliage is adorned with small blue flowers which emerge in late spring and bloom through mid summer.

#### **Benefits for Wildlife**

- Flowers attract bees, flies, and butterflies
- · Songbirds and turkeys eat the seeds

## **Benefits for People**

- Greens can be cooked and eaten
- Divide the plant to propogate it, or leave the seeds to allow it to spread on its own
- Grasslike groundcover with bonus flowers!
